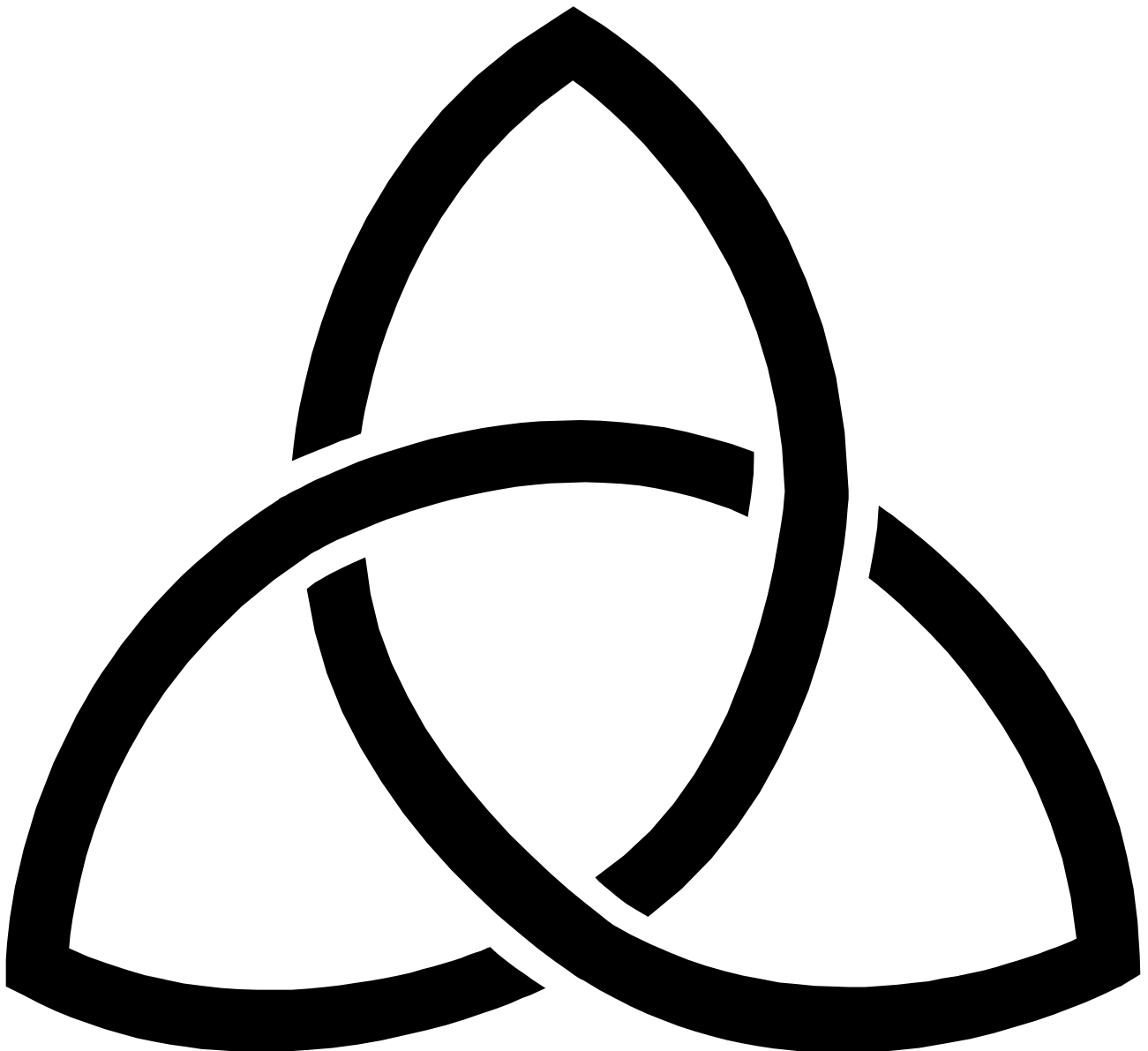

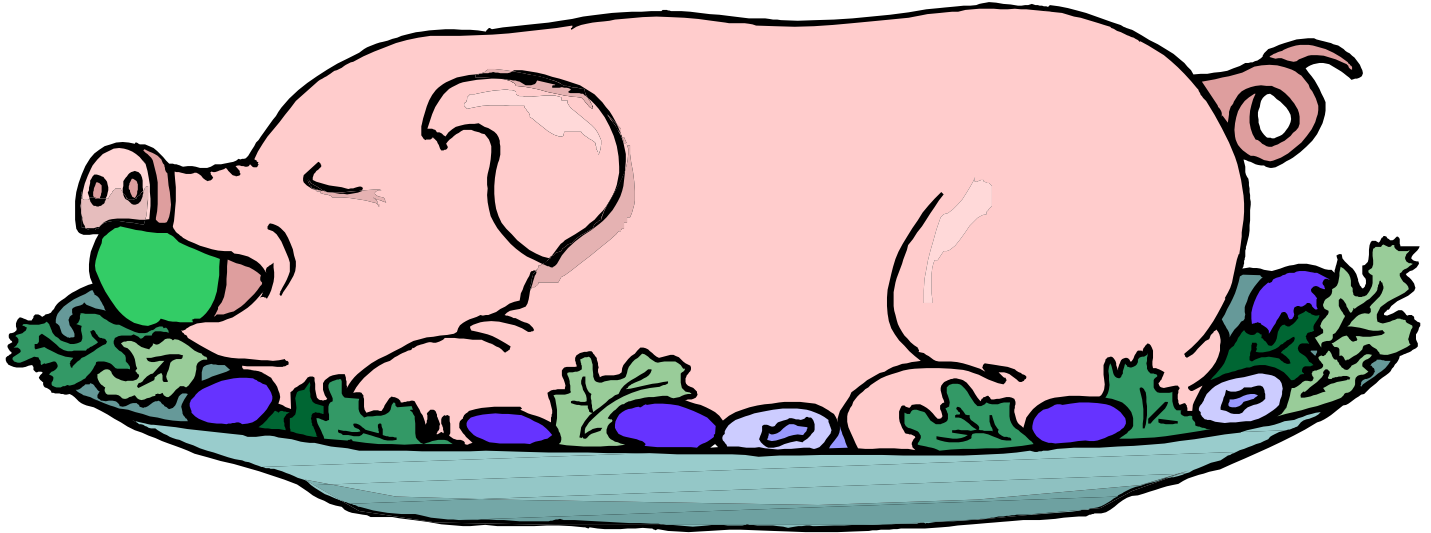

Tuesday evenings begin with a meal and worship. Core reading for each lecture is available on line. Very helpful notes are provided for each lecture and a recording of the lecture is available on line. Books for the essays are available in the college library and articles from journals are available on line. Almost all the books are in print, I purchased a number of books and would be very pleased to loan these out.

PCC Meeting 4 July 2013

The PCC met on Thursday 4 July 2013, the main areas of discussion were as follows:

- Richard reported that the London Diocesan mission action plan “Capital Vision 2020” was launched on 6 June at St Paul’s Cathedral and will be filtering down through the parishes. The three themes are
 - *Confidence* – in proclaiming the Gospel,
 - *Compassion* how do we show love of Christ to those in need in parishes, London and globally
 - *Creativity*: to encourage new ways to reach out
- The Mission and Outreach committee will meet in July to plan our response. This will be an ongoing approach from now to 2020.
- Our major collection in June for Christian Aid raised £768.
- Kevin gave his last Youth Minister’s report to the PCC which demonstrated a wide range of activities being provided for our Young People with generally good levels of attendance. Preparations for Holiday Club are well advanced and numbers are looking good. Five First Communion candidates have completed a ten week course of preparation and will take their first communion on 7 July, when the new Archdeacon of Northolt will preside.
- Margaret Nicholson proposed a vote of thanks to Kevin on behalf of the PCC. RB explained that there would be two more opportunities for the congregation to thank Kevin; firstly on Friday 19 July at a bring and share barbecue from 7pm at which Jon Hooper and his band will be providing music; and at the service on Sunday 28 July when there will be a formal thank you from the church.
- Graham Hamwijk presented an income statement up to end of June 2013, which demonstrated that income is slightly ahead of budget at the half year albeit with a few exceptional items. The bank balance remains healthy.
- Andrew Newell presented a paper on the Common Fund Offer for 2014. The Finance committee have looked carefully at the figures and agreed that we would like to support the increased costs for clergy and the increase in training for clergy and laity, which are consistent with Capital Vision 2020, and recommended a 4.4% increase taking our overall Common Fund offer for 2014 to £108,840, 148.3% of Standard Parish Cost. This was agreed unanimously by the PCC.
- Following Kevin Draper’s resignation, a month of consultation has taken place, which has included an open meeting, invitation to write, meetings with the young people and children, from which there have resulted some ideas on how we would like to move forward with our Youth & Family Ministry. This is an opportunity to do something different after 12 years. The working group has met and Richard is now drawing together the ideas for a job specification in preparation for the next meeting on 21 July. The PCC were asked to decide whether the post should be full or part time, and agreed that it should be a full time post with a wider remit for families
- In the interim, Kevin’s contract ends on 31 August, the family will move out and the house will need redecorating in preparation for a six month let, at the end of

which it would be available for the new employee to start in April 2014. It was agreed that the house would be redecorated at “best value” and gas and electricity safety certificates obtained.

- As far as children and young people’s work is concerned, all activities will be kept running as much as possible, and Richard outlined the interim arrangements.
- Sally Rogers reported that the redecoration of the Hall will start on 5 August and volunteers were invited to help clear as much as possible on Saturday 3/Sunday 4 August, after the Holiday Club.
- The redecoration should be completed in three weeks and the floor will be refurbished in the final week of August.
- The additional lights are now installed on the tracking. The colours have been decided: white/neutral and blue. Black out blinds with pulleys are to be installed and the curtains will have pulley systems and metal tracks.
- RB thanked Sally Rogers and the group for all their work.
- Rental rates for the hall were discussed and it was agreed they will be reviewed after 1 January 2014.
- An increase in the budget to £12,000 to allow for harder wearing paint to be used was agreed unanimously.
- Brian Watkins reported on the work of the Finance Committee, including back up arrangements for the financial information being held electronically, work to assess the potential for letting the property at 5 Tanworth Close for 6 months, considerable increase in workload to support Gift Aid arrangements, and a review of the Investment Arrangements. The Committee recommended that part of our Investment Holdings, £15k, are invested in a London Diocese Missional Housing Bond for 5 years, this was approved by the PCC. Finally, it was proposed that members of the Planned Giving Scheme are invited annually to increase their giving in line with general levels of inflation.
- Andrew Newell reported on the work of the Plant & Hall Committee. Asbestos tiles have been removed from the chair cupboard in the hall. Thanks to the Harrow Deanery funding, the youth project of creating a patio outside the Parish Rooms is being done by a local contractor in order to meet the deadline. John Chapman was thanked for the complete refurbishment of the gate to the Garden of Remembrance.
- Carole Hamwijk updated the PCC on the planned activities over the summer, including the Garden Party on 6 July to include refreshments, games for children, gazebos; Macmillan coffee morning to be held on 27 Sept from 9-11.30am - Donations welcome; Harvest to be held on Sunday 6 October after the main worship service with a hog roast at £10 a head, £5 for children, under 5s free. Aim is to sell up to 150 tickets in advance. Outside firm to do the catering, we will provide desserts, own drink, and hold a “pie” auction and provide entertainment for the children.
- Carole Hamwijk provided a report on Holy Trinity School. This included a very successful PTFA Family Fun Event on 29 June to raise funds for the playground which raised over £4,000; the achievement of a gold standard for the quality of the RE due to the quality of their music, displays and teaching; Northwood Residents Association have donated £2,000 for class instruments; Sports day

taking place on 5 July; and this year's summer production "The Tempest" on 17 and 18 July.

- Pupil bursary set up by the Governing Body in response to requests from families for help in purchasing uniform, stationary and subsidies for school trips. The school are asking parents, local bodies and churches for donations, and the PCC agreed to donate £250 for this purpose.
- Sven Beyrich's term of office as a Governor at Holy Trinity School comes to an end this summer but he has agreed to stand for another three years. The PCC unanimously agreed that Sven Beyrich continues as representative of the PCC on the School Governing Body. Sven was thanked and it was noted that he chairs the Personnel and Admissions committees.
- Future Meetings – The next PCC Meeting is scheduled for the 26 September 2013.

The first disciples always seemed to be journeying, from the shore of the sea, to the busy streets of the town, through the regions of Galilee, Gerasene and Samaria. As the disciples journeyed with Jesus, and as they travelled together, they learned more and more about this carpenter from Nazareth. Until at Caesarea Philippi, Jesus asked, “Who do you say that I am?” and Simon Peter was able to reply, “You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God.” There followed the longest and most important journey to Jerusalem, the house of Caiaphas, the Palace of Pilate and then the Cross at Calvary.

Because journeys seem to be so important, this Autumn, a few of us are planning to journey together and, through our journeying, to explore the Christian Faith. Though important, we are trusting that the time together will also be great fun.

The practical arrangements for the journey are as follows:

From 8pm, on Tuesday evenings, in the Parish Rooms at Holy Trinity, for about 1 hour 30 minutes. Stages in the journey...

24 Sept. A meal to begin the journey.

1 Oct. Believing in God.

8 Oct. God in our lives.

15 Oct. The life and ministry of Jesus.

22 Oct. The death and resurrection of Jesus.

5 Nov. The Holy Spirit.

12 Nov. Being a Christian.

19 Nov. Learning to pray.

26 Nov. Reading the Bible.

3 Dec. Being Church.

10 Dec. Sharing Holy Communion.

7 Jan [2014] A meal to conclude this phase of our journey.

We plan to use material from the Emmaus course to guide our journeying. However, the experiences of those who journey with us, their insights and understandings will be of much greater value.

Please do think about joining us.

The journey really is for anyone and everyone:

- Those who have been a Christian all their lives;
- Those who are still unsure about Jesus;
- Those who have always come to Church;
- Those who have just started coming to Church;
- Those who are thinking about coming to Church.

For some of us, the journey will be an opportunity to remember afresh what we have known for a long time. For others, it will be a time to prepare for confirmation. In January, there will be an opportunity to either be confirmed by Bishop Pete or to rededicate our lives to God and to His service, but this is not a requirement of the journey.

If you think that the journey might be for you, why not come on 24 September and then make a final decision after the meal. If you are interested, please have a word with either Richard or me [just to help with catering numbers for 24 September]. If you can only come to some of the stages, that is absolutely fine. If you need transport, please let me know.

Answers to a Quiz on 'Sound' :

1. Simon and Garfunkel; Paul Simon in 1964.
2. 'Sounds' eg Milford Sound, Marlborough Sound. The only English coastal sound is Plymouth Sound. From old Norse : 'sund' a 'strait, narrow enough to be swum' or 'to separate' (English = asunder).
3. Mach 1 after Ernst Mach (1838-1916). Christian Doppler (1803-53)
4. A blue whale emits the loudest cry of any creature (170 decibels, a jet engine = 110 decibels) and its low frequency sound travels 4 times faster in water and will travel hundreds if not thousands of miles!
5. August Horch was ousted from his automobile company (founded by him in 1899) and could not take his brand name with him. An inaugural meeting was held in his home with his son doing his Latin homework in a corner. No-one could think of a suitable name until his son piped up with : 'Horch means 'Hark' or 'Hear'(in German), use the Latin equivalent : 'Audi', (the imperative form of audire, 'to listen').
6. A Whistler (French). He broke box office records worldwide.
7. His work on a Mississippi paddle steamer was to take soundings of the river bed and call out the depth, a safe reading was 'mark twain'
The two fathom mark on the sounding line (12 feet).
8. 'Uhu' is the sound made by the eagle owl (also the German for it), found in the Black Forest (Germany) where the glue is manufactured.
