

Dear friends

The Christian Year can become so familiar a pattern that we are no longer transformed or excited by the prospect of singing and saying “Jesus Christ is risen today, He is risen indeed, Allelulia”. And yet, everything around us sings the melody: the spring sunshine, the beauty of the daffodils and cherry blossom, the early bird song, the natural joy and vitality of a bank-holiday weekend (even if it does rain, again!).

Those of us who have endeavoured to maintain a disciplined and self-giving Lent can perhaps feel a little more excited even if only because we can drink tea again and eat chocolate, but this is no reason to feel self-satisfied or smug. The reality is that we all know that it is not easy to believe in the resurrection. Sometimes people blame the times we live in but every generation in every age has found Easter difficult to take in. It is not just the scientific mind which finds it difficult to believe. When the women arrived at the tomb on the first Easter morning they were terrified by what they had seen and only gradually did they find their way to belief. Is it any wonder that we find it difficult some 2000 years later?

The truth about the resurrection is that each of us has to recognise it and with God’s grace find it ourselves. And how do we do that? By recognising the way in which God is present in our lives, how God brings light out of darkness in our lives when we turn to Him in hurt, in failure, in rejection. When we rejoice in the beauty of creation, the smile of a child, shared laughter, a shared meal - those are our resurrection moments.

When the women went to the garden to tend Jesus’ body they wondered how they would move the stone away from the entrance to the grave. They need not have worried. When they arrived, the stone had already been rolled away. God had already acted.

God is already acting in our lives but perhaps we have not recognised it. May we be able to say this Easter “Jesus Christ is risen, He is risen indeed” with truth and conviction because we have started to recognise our resurrection moments, the action of God in our lives.

### **First Communion course:**

#### **Preparation for Children to Receive Holy Communion Summer Term 2014**

Since 2008 at Holy Trinity Church children have been admitted to receive Holy Communion following a course of instruction. We will be running a course again this year.

The course will take place during the summer term on **Wednesday evenings 4.15pm – 5.15pm** in Holy Trinity Church commencing Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> May. Towards the end of the course the children will be admitted to receive Holy Communion in a Special Service on **Sunday 6<sup>th</sup> July at 10am**.

The course is open to children in Junior School in Year 4 and above who are part of the family of Holy Trinity Church.

This is not Confirmation, which takes places later in the young person's spiritual development (usually year 8 or above). The course for Confirmation takes place in the Autumn and Spring terms.

Please talk to your child about this and decide together if this is something they wish to explore at this stage of their spiritual journey. Receiving communion is both a privilege and a responsibility, as we discover together in the course. Please do not hesitate to contact Ann Kentfield if you have any questions. We will need to know by 27<sup>th</sup> April who will be taking part in the course this year.



## **PCC Meetings November 2013 and January 2014**

The PCC met on Wednesday 20 November 2013, and 30 January 2014 the main areas of discussion were as follows: -

- Richard thanked all those who participated in a successful Moor Park 10k sponsored run, which had raised £1,284 for the Lynda Jackson Centre.
- The Harvest Festival had been a huge success and thanks were given to Carole Hamwijk and David Lee in particular for arranging the Hog Roast which packed the newly refurbished Parish Hall to the limits, and attracted twice as many people to celebrate Harvest together than previous years. The event will be repeated next year.
- All Saints Service saw the Festival Choir perform the Haydn Little Organ Mass, the All Souls service was again well attended with refreshments afterwards provided by the Parish Visiting Team, and the Remembrance Service this year included the act of remembrance at 11am.
- Chiltern Hundreds Bach Choir also returned in the autumn to perform a new requiem which was much appreciated by those who attended.
- The Advent and Christmas season services were well attended including the Candlelit Carol Service, the Christingle All Age Service, and the Christmas Eve and Christmas Day services. In addition we undertook outreach via the Carols at Costa and Carol Singing around the Care Homes and Pubs in the Parish.
- The Confirmation Service on 12 January saw Bishop Pete confirm 10 candidates, and this was followed by a celebration in the Parish Hall.
- There was a service for Christian Unity at Fairfield Church on 19 January which was well supported by Holy Trinity.
- Richard & Sally Rogers updated the PCC on recruitment for a new Minister for Children, Young People and Families, initial adverts did not realise sufficient applicants and after re-advertising interviews were undertaken in early January of 4 applicants. However, after careful consideration it was decided not to appoint any of the candidates, and further work will be undertaken to refine our key priorities for the role so that a more focussed brief can be re-advertised.
- During February Holy Trinity will again be collecting for the Hillingdon Food Bank.
- On Sunday 16 March we will hold a Matins at 10am in place of the usual Parish Communion.

- On Sunday 23 March the Chiltern Hundreds Bach Choir will again perform at our 6am service.
- In Richard's absence we will not run a major fundraising event this year for Lent. As an alternative we will encourage members of our congregation to sign up for the Christian Aid "Count your Blessings" Lent programme. We will also run a number of Lent Lunches and the proceeds from these and the Mothering Sunday collection will be donated to the Bishop of London Mission Fund and ALMA.
- Sally Rogers reported that Richard & Jenny had redecorated the main rooms in the Vicarage, and the Vicarage was being re-carpeted during December.
- Sally also reported that the floor in the Parish Hall had been resealed during Half term and that John Chapman had reduced the size of the Stage Steps to make them more manoeuvrable, and the current phase of the Hall refurbishment was now complete. The PCC recorded their thanks to Sally for all her hard work in seeing this through. Four donations have been received for chairs to be used in the Hall lobby, and the donors' names will be recorded in the donors book.
- Andrew Newell reported that a Stewardship Campaign would be launched on 4 February to encourage existing Planned Giving members to increase their giving in line with inflation, and to seek new members of the Planned Giving scheme.
- Graham Hamwijk updated both meetings on the state of the finances, the final outturn, subject to review by the Independent Examiner was a small deficit on the General Fund of less than £1k, and whilst this looked like a good result it had to be borne in mind that this was greatly helped by the Youth minister leaving in September which was unplanned. The Designated fund shows a large deficit reflecting the significant expenditure during the year on the Parish Hall refurbishment, the exploratory expenditure on improvements to the Heating System, and expenditure of the Church guttering.
- Graham Hamwijk tabled a budget for 2014, which recognised the significant investment being made in the Ministry Team with recruitment of the Minister for Children, Young People and Families, the Training Curate, and an Assistant Youth Worker. The PCC have approved a budget with a deficit on the general fund of almost £10k, recognising that income and fundraising will need to be increased to close the gap.
- Andrew Newell reported on the Church Heating Project, the project team have recommended progressing an upgrade to the pipework in

the Church Building to replace the existing one pipe system with a two pipe system and the addition of some additional radiators / Finned tubes with the aim of increasing the heat output within the Church. This approach will mean that the existing boilers can be retained and will keep the costs of the upgrade to an acceptable level. The PCC have approved further design work to be undertaken on this basis with the aim of tendering for the work in the Spring, and subject to obtaining a faculty, to undertake the works over the summer months in 2014.

- John Spencer has been leading the PCC through a review of our Mission Action Plan. There have so far been two discussions on the elements of the plan which deal with being Confident and Compassionate, and the final element on being Creative will be considered at the March PCC meeting. Once approved by the PCC this will be launched at the APCM in April 2014.
- The PCC approved the Safeguarding Policy Statement at its November meeting and this will now be displayed on notice boards in the Parish hall.
- The PCC approved the letting of Tanworth Close on a short 6 month let until June 2014.
- Andrew Newell reported on the work of the Plant & Hall Committee, the leaking flat roof over the Kitchen in the Parish hall had been repaired, Church Guttering and downpipes have been replaced where necessary and painted, significant refurbishment of Tanworth Close has been undertaken, repairs to lighting in the car park, and Perspex sheets covering Church windows have been refixed.
- The Who's Who Board has now been fitted by the South Door in Church.
- Autumn Bazaar raised £862 for Charity, being split between RNIB Sunshine House and Sight Savers.
- A quiz night is being organised for 15 March in aid of the Church Heating Project.
- Talking Point have taken the initiative to serve cakes and refreshments once a month after the 10am service at tables to commence on 9 February 2014.
- Family Fete and barbecue will be held this year on Saturday 14 June 2014 12 noon to 4pm. David Lee has agreed to Chair the Fete Committee this year.
- Carole Hamwijk reported on Holy Trinity School, an outdoor reflective garden has been created, school has been awarded "Best primary School Act of Worship" by Watford New Hope Trust for their Harvest

Festival, two teachers visited the school from the link school in Malawi during the autumn, Godly Play room has been completed and was opened by the Mayor of Hillingdon, school celebrated RE week with a Narnia theme, Year 5 children undertook a pilgrimage to St Albans, School Choir invited to sing at Northwood Festive evening in December and O2 arena in January, and the school will have to upgrade its kitchens to comply with latest Government legislation.

- Deanery Synod met at Holy Trinity on 27 November, refreshments were served afterwards in the Parish hall to mark the end of Richard's term as Area Dean. He has been succeeded by Philip Barnes the vicar of St Edmunds in Northwood Hills.
- Future Meetings – The next PCC Meeting is scheduled for the 27 March 2014.

## MENGO REVISITED

Last September I was privileged to be invited back to Mengo Hospital for the annual graduation ceremony of medical laboratory students and student nurses. It was my first visit to Mengo since leaving to work at The Nairobi Hospital 3 years ago.

On arrival, the master of ceremonies announced: 'I would like to recognise the founder and former Principal of the School of Medical Laboratory Technology, Mr. Ray "Mubiru" Wood.' ("Mubiru" was the name which had been given to me by the chief of the Mamba clan in Uganda.) Amid much applause, I was escorted to take my place with other dignitaries in the V.I.P. tent.

A colourful ceremony followed: first, a procession of selected students and staff led by a dreadfully out-of-tune Boys' Brigade band; then, the obligatory long speeches; and, finally, a delightful display of traditional African dancing by the students.

During the ceremony I reflected on the many challenges and frustrations I had experienced in Mengo – my home for 18 years. My initial mission, scheduled to last two years, had been to rehabilitate and develop the hospital's diagnostic laboratory services. I soon realised, however, that sustainable rehabilitation would never be achieved without effective, high-quality training. Therefore, with Ministry of Health approval, we established a designated training school, initially with just three students.

How far things have progressed since those rudimentary beginnings! At this year's ceremony, no less than 98 students graduated, bringing the total number to pass through the school to 899. Most of these graduates are now successfully deployed in dispensaries, clinics and hospitals throughout Uganda; some have gone into laboratory research; a few have secured prestigious posts abroad.

To witness the fruition of my 18 years' work was immensely satisfying, but I am well aware that none of this could have been achieved without the enormous help of Holy Trinity and many others. Thank you for your prayers, and for supporting this most worthwhile of projects.
